WHAT IS SEE LEARNING™?

Social, Emotional, and Ethical Learning (SEE Learning) is an education program developed at Emory University for international use with the vision of "a compassionate and ethical world for all."

SEE Learning is the culmination of an academic collaboration that began in 1998 between Emory University and the Dalai Lama, who has long called for an education of heart and mind. The program conveys a universal, non-sectarian, and science-based approach to bringing the ethical development of the whole child into education.

SEE Learning enhances Social Emotional Learning (SEL) programming with key additional components, including:

- attention training
- · compassion and ethical discernment
- systems thinking
- resilience and trauma-informed practice

This program provides educators with a developmentally-staged curriculum consisting of easy-to-implement lessons, the conceptual framework used to design the curriculum, and resources for educator preparation and development. SEE Learning empowers students to engage ethically as part of a global community and provides educators with the tools to support student well-being.

BRINGING SEE LEARNING™ TO SPAIN



A non profit organization has been established to bring SEE learning to Spain: the Institute for Emotional, Ethical, and Social Education (In Spanish: Instituto para la Educación Emocional, Ética y Social, IE3S) that:

- aims to give universal access to SEE Learning, avoiding an educational divide due to economic reasons by trying to ensure that this type of education reaches all kind of schools and educational institutions no matter their financial status;
- is an initiative of the civil society and the education sector that aims to involve public institutions and administrations.
- is non-for-profit;
- is a collaborative initiative, locally and internationally;
- offers high-quality training and support to educators;
- supports high-quality research on SEE Learning;
- ensures that the requirements and agreements with Emory University are respected;
- and ensures that the ethos and values of SEE Learning is preserved.

The Initiative includes:

- Training of facilitators to train and support educators.
- Translation and adaptation of the materials to be appropriate to the regional language and culture.
- Implementation of the program at selected centers to obtain feedback and perform research in collaboration with the International Team. Implementation at other centers.
- Evaluation and improvement of the adaptation, according to the conclusions reached from the feedback and research.
- Offering training and support to improve the welfare of educators.
- Training for families in aspects related to SEE Learning and to improve the welfare of parents.
- Adaptation of SEE Learning for social workers.
- Sending feedback, translated and adapted materials, new materials, and resources developed by the Institute to Emory University.

The Initiative also aims to contribute to establishing models for the implementation of SEE Learning that could be helpful for other countries.
